WHY HELSTON? WHY NOW?


Helston's streets have been neglected for decades, and we now demand better. The kennels and the streets are a symbol of the care taken in the town and the pride in Helston's heritage and community.

**Decline in Town Centre footfall:** 


Between 2009 & 2017, (Pre-Covid19) there was a total 17.4% REDUCTION in town centre footfall.

By October 2020 this had reduced to around 34% for small - medium size towns.

There is an opportunity NOW to repair damaged kennels, pavements and streets. And to restore and conserve architecture and built form...









...activate the streets and frontages, and to restore, repair, enhance and conserve the streets and Helston's high quality architecture.

Oslo has removed cars from much of its city centre to create pedestrian priority streets.

Despite fears from business owners that trade would suffer as a result, there are 10% more pedestrians in Oslo. (statistics from the World Economic Forum)
