Situated at the head of the Lizard Peninsula, Helston (Hellys in Cornish) is a historic market town in West Cornwall and one of the county's oldest. It's known for its traditional granite buildings, open water channels called 'kennels' that run along many streets, and the famous Flora Day dance - an ancient spring festival.
